MARKING AND LABELING


ALL HAZMAT SHIPMENTS MUST BE MARKED AND LABELED WITH:

Hazard Class Label ...

- Hazard class labels must be 3.9 inches (100 mm) on each side, and placed in the diamond formation.
- Primary and subsidiary hazard class labels must be placed within 6 inches of each other.

Proper Shipping Name

- Proper shipping name needs to be on freight, and placed near the hazard class label(s).
- If shipping a generic material, the chemical or technical name must be listed in parenthesis after n.o.s. (not otherwise specified).



ID Number

The **UN number** (or NA number) needs to be listed below or near the shipping name.

Consignee's Info:

Freight must list the name and address of consignee (final destination).

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

Bulk Shipments

Bulk shipments are labeled with **Placards** displaying the **UN Number**, but must still be marked with **proper shipping name** and **consignee address.**

Overpack label

Overpack sticker must be displayed on shipments that are consolidated in such a way that the hazard class labels are not visible.

Orientation Arrows:

Liquid non-bulk hazmat shipments must be marked with orientation arrows.

<u>Limited Quantity</u>

LTD QTY shipments only require the label, and do not need a proper shipping name or UN number marking.
