

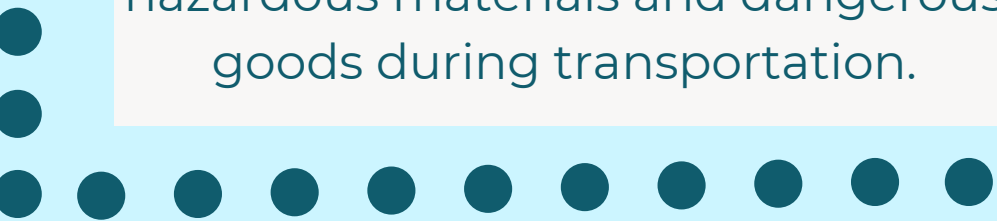

A **Hazmat ID number** is a unique **four-digit code** used to identify hazardous materials and dangerous goods during transportation.



This four-digit ID system ensures that **emergency responders can quickly recognize the material** and appropriately react in the event of a spill.



WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

UN (United Nations) numbers are required for international shipping. UN numbers may also be used for domestic shipping. More often than not, you will see **UN** preceding the four-digit ID number.

NA (North America) numbers are only permitted for domestic transport. Since Alaska is part of the United States, we cannot cross international borders with this ID. We must only cross borders with the internationally recognized UN identification number.

Attention Drivers:

Do not cross the Canadian border with a NA declaration on your hazmat shipping documents!
